Lawrence Academy was chartered in 1968 by the Bertie Educational Foundation. The school was originally called Bertie Academy and changed to Lawrence Academy in 1974. The school is an independent, coeducational, nondenominational college preparatory school. Lawrence Academy is committed to the principle of equal opportunity. Discrimination based upon race, national origin, religion, sex, age, disability, or political affiliation is strictly prohibited. Lawrence educates students from seven counties in eastern North Carolina: Bertie, Chowan, Martin, Pasquotank, Perquimans, Tyrrell, and Washington. The Academy is philosophically committed to student attainment and mastery of basic educational principles, and as an institution chartered to serve young people, it is committed to the total growth of the Lawrence student, academically, socially, and morally. It shall provide an environment, which is conducive to learning and one which encourages every child to realize his or her fullest potential.

Campus

The forty-nine acre rural site includes 27 classrooms, 2 science labs, 2 computer labs, 1 cafeteria, 1 library, 4 playing fields, 1 playground, 5 buildings, 1 gymnasium, and 1 recreational center.

Standardized Testing

High School Curriculum 2018-10

As an accredited independent school, Lawrence Academy maintains a testing program designed to show growth at each grade level. Incoming Kindergarten students take the KRT (Kindergarten Readiness Test) as a measure of determining readiness for kindergarten work. Grades 1-9 take the Stanford Achievement Test, which is used to evaluate their achievement from grade to grade. Students in grades 10-12 take the PSAT and SAT or ACT in preparation for college admission. These tests are not used as a promotion tool, but as a guide for our staff as they prepare to teach the *individual* student.
